Addiction Medicine Clinician Support Line

BC Centre on Substance (BCCSU)

Primary care providers can connect with an Addiction Medicine Specialist 24/7, 365 days a year. Access expertise in addiction medicine (including emergency, acute, and community care). Consultation can include support in screening, assessment, treatment, and management of substance use and substance use disorders.



Addiction Care and Treatment Online Course (ACTOC)

A comprehensive 22-module online course for health care providers who diagnose and treat patients with substance use disorders using evidence-based treatments along a continuum of care.



Rapid Access to Consultative Expertise (RACE)

A call-back service for primary care providers. Medical staff can generate a request to receive local specialist addiction medicine advice within two hours. Service available Monday to Friday (excluding statutory holidays), 8am to 5pm.



The BC Centre on Substance Use (BCCSU)

Comprehensive education and training program provides the tools for prescribing oral opioid agonist treatment (buprenorphine/naloxone, methadone, and slow-release oral morphine) and injectable opioid agonist treatment (hydromorphone and diacetylmorphine).
