Health Data Coalition

The PCN is reaching out to you today to ask if you would consider sharing your clinic level data on the Health Data Coalition platform to support program development.

Many of you are likely familiar with the [Health Data Coalition \(HDC\)](#) developed many years ago by family physicians. The HDC is a physician-led and governed data sharing application that enables collaborative quality improvement in primary care. The HDC Discover application provides secure access to aggregated clinical data while maintaining both patient and physician confidentiality and can assist you in assessing your own practice in areas such as chronic disease management or medication prescribing.

Physicians across BC are connected through HDC's platform, which provides context for your own practice over time, as well as allowing you to view, share and compare an ever-growing number of relevant clinical measures with colleagues. The value of you and your colleagues' shared understanding empowers communities to act if needed.

The data you share will only show fully anonymized, population level data and you can stop sharing data at any time. The information helps the Division assess the number of patients living with chronic disease who are supported within our catchment area, e.g., number of patients with diabetes, COPD, hypertension, anxiety, depression, etc. This fully anonymized population data helps the PCN better understand the needs in our community.

In 1990, he was hired as Executive Director for Native Participation in the 1994 Commonwealth Games, when Victoria welcomed the world, and educated them about Victoria and the three Island Nations.

Danny says that he thanks the many Elders of his communities for their words in his lifetime and carry them with him daily: "Whatever you do at work or play, come to work with enthusiasm, respect, and a passion. Every decision we make has an impact. Elders teach us to leave our personal differences on an imaginary nail at the door and walk in with an open mind before we walk in the door. With respect, we can make changes."

Allied Health Data Evaluation Survey

Quality improvement is key to the work we do in the PCN. As part of a larger evaluation process, we are launching a PCN specific allied health data collection survey and patient survey in the fall.

The purpose of the survey is to collect data on how allied health consultants spend their time, the services they provide, and the resources they need so that the PCN can effectively advocate for and support their needs. This data will also inform orientation of new staff joining the PCN.

The data collected in this survey will complement other data such as encounter codes, pharmacy data provided to the Ministry and qualitative data from interviews.
